DEPENDENT CHILD (445) VISA - DOCUMENT CHECKLIST

- ◆ YOU MUST PROVIDE ALL OF THE DOCUMENTS LISTED BELOW WHEN LODGING AN APPLICATION FOR A DEPENDENT CHILD (SUBCLASS 445) VISA

- Evidence of payment of the **VISA APPLICATION CHARGE**. If there is more than one child, an application form (918) must be completed for each, but only one fee is payable if the applications are lodged together.
- [Form 918](#) *Application for a Subclass 445 (Temporary) Visa by a Dependent Child*, fully completed and signed by the applicant (or their responsible guardian) and the sponsor
- Two recent passport sized, colour **PHOTOGRAPHS** of the applicant
- Certified copy of the applicant's **BIRTH CERTIFICATE**
- Evidence that parent of the applicant holds one of the following visas:
- Partner (Temporary) (Class UK) Subclasses 820 and 826
 - Partner (Provisional) (Class UF) Subclasses 309 and 310
 - Extended Eligibility (Temporary) (Class TK) Subclass 445

NOTE – If the parent already holds a permanent visa (eg: Subclass 100 or 801) this is NOT the correct visa to apply for. The child should apply for a Child Visa (Subclass 101)

- Evidence that the sponsor is an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen (e.g. Australian citizenship certificate, copy of passport identification pages, copy of permanent visa)
- Penal clearance certificates (police clearance certificates) for all applicants aged 16 years or over. Penal clearance certificates are required from every country you have been in for 12 months or more (cumulatively) during the last 10 years, since turning 16. **You MUST provide the ORIGINAL - Certified copies of these certificates are NOT acceptable.** Information on how to obtain these certificates is at www.immi.gov.au/allforms/character-requirements/

For all applicants aged under 18 years:

- A penal clearance certificate (police clearance) for the sponsor **and** for the sponsor's partner for each country they have been in for 12 months or more (cumulatively) during the last 10 years (including Australia) since turning 16. Information on the character requirement and how to obtain penal clearance certificates is at www.immi.gov.au/allforms/character-requirements/
- All people with custody of the child **must** provide full consent for the child to migrate to Australia.
- A certified/ notarised copy of the child's birth certificate showing the parents' names; **AND**
 - Certified permission from the parent not travelling with the child, approving the child's permanent migration to Australia; **AND**
 - A copy of the passport identification pages of the parent not travelling with the child or other identity documents with that person's signature; **OR**
 - A legal document (such as a court decision) depriving the non-migrating parent of parental rights

For all applicants aged over 18 years:

[Form 80](#), *Personal Particulars for Character Assessment*, for applicants aged 18 or over, signed by that person, with all questions answered. **FAILURE TO PROVIDE THIS COMPLETED FORM CAN RESULT IN VERY LENGTHY DELAYS PROCESSING YOUR APPLICATION**

Evidence of the applicant's dependency on the sponsor

- Evidence that the applicant is financially dependent on their sponsor for the basic needs of food, shelter and clothing, and how long this support has been provided. Evidence may include bank statements, money transfers, rent receipts etc.
- evidence of continuing and current enrolment in studies (High School and College/University transcripts and/or certificates verifying current enrolment at school)

All applicants for permanent entry to Australia must undertake a medical examination with an approved panel doctor. Applicants over 11 years of age will also need to undertake a chest x-ray.

Further information may be requested depending on your individual circumstances. If this is the case, you will be advised after your application has been received and assessed.

Please note: If your sponsor, migration agent, or any third person is seeking information about your application, we must have your written consent to liaise with that person. You may provide this permission on the application form, in writing, or by providing a completed, signed [Form 956](#) or [Form 956A](#)

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- ◆ PERSONAL AND IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS, SUCH AS BIRTH, ADOPTION, DEATH CERTIFICATES AND OTHER OFFICIAL DOCUMENTATION, MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CERTIFIED ENGLISH TRANSLATION. DOCUMENTS SHOULD BE CERTIFIED (BY A NOTARY IF OUTSIDE AUSTRALIA) AND TRANSLATED BY AN ACCREDITED TRANSLATOR.
 - ◆ COPIES OF SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS, SUCH AS WORK CERTIFICATES, EDUCATIONAL DOCUMENTS AND BANK STATEMENTS DO NOT HAVE TO BE CERTIFIED. HOWEVER, IF THEY ARE IN LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH OR RUSSIAN THEY SHOULD BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CERTIFIED ENGLISH TRANSLATION.
